

## Lesson One - Introduction and Street Name Quiz

Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To recall prior knowledge of French vocabulary.</li> <li>• To build a bank of strategies which are useful when reading French.</li> <li>• To increase intercultural understanding.</li> </ul>
Success criteria	<p>You will be able to recognise the names of some French streets. You should be able to describe the kinds of names the French use for their streets.</p> <p>You could discuss which strategies have helped in reading the French text today.</p>
Prep	<p>Pupils work in groups of 3 or 4</p> <p>Each group has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1 x A3 laminated street map</li> <li>1 set of cut up quiz cards</li> <li>1 blank Reponses sheet</li> </ul>
Starter	<p>The class, together with the teacher, should look at the menu page of the play in particular the Bonus section. Firstly 'Un mot des Auteurs', followed by a brief look at 'Dico d'argot', the slang dictionary and also 'Les Tubes de l'été' which talks about famous French singers. This page has a link to the street plan for the following activity.</p>
Activity 1	<p>Pupils work in groups of three or four. Each group is given an A3 copy of the map. Look at the street map of St Bonnet-le-Froid. Are there any words which the pupils recognise?</p>
Activity 2	<p>Each group is given a set of quiz cards. The cards are placed upside down on the table. Pupils take it in turns to pick up a card and read it out loud. They then try to work out the correct place on the map. The rest of the group can help if necessary. Answers are written down on the blank grid and when finished, the group swaps with another group to check their answers.</p> <p>Some questions have more than one correct answer.</p>
Plenary	<p>The class discusses how they have come up with the answers. What kind of activity is it? Which strategies did they use i.e. cognates, prior knowledge etc.</p> <p>How do French street names differ from English street names?</p>
